Our House system

When your daughter joins IGGS she is assigned a House.

The House system underpins our pastoral care program and encourages involvement, leadership, loyalty, responsibility, co-operation and good discipline amongst all our girls. The School has five Houses named after our first five headmistresses: Hunt, Connell, White, Armitage and Carter.

Transport

The IGGS campus is located in the heart of Ipswich, overlooking the Bremer River, on the corner of Queen Victoria Parade and Chermside Road, East Ipswich. Our main entrance is via Chermside Road, beside the School's tennis courts.

Drop-off zones are located at the front of the School along Chermside Road. We also provide a private bus charter service for students that we share with Ipswich Junior Grammar School and Ipswich Grammar School. Each year, our bus routes are revised in consideration of where our students live and how many pick-up points can be accommodated along a route.

Buses deliver students in time for the 8.15am start of the school day and depart from the School shortly after 3.00pm. Late buses, departing from 4.45pm, are available Monday to Thursdays for students who participate in activities after school. Our website contains the most up to date bus routes and fares.

How to Enrol

Step 1: Submit your Enrolment Application Form

Apply online along with payment of the \$110 application fee

Provide supporting documents:

- Birth Certificate or Current Passport
- NAPLAN
- Student's last two report cards if applicable
- Student's VISA if not an Australian citizen
- Specialist or Medical reports if applicable
- Court orders if application

Step 2: Attend interview

Upon review of your application you may be invited to attend an enrolment interview with your child.

Step 3: Respond to Offer of a Place

You will be offered a place if your child's application and interview are successful. To accept this place, please return the signed Acceptance of Offer form, along with payment of a non-refundable confirmation fee of \$500.

Step 4: Orientation and Medical Forms

- Complete Orientation and Medical History forms and return to Enrolments Registrar prior to commencing.
- Attend any relevant orientation sessions/days
- · Purchase uniform and stationery requirements
